The Reverend Nina Fulford

Nina was born in London, England, baptized in the Church of England and attended a Methodist Sunday School in Surrey. Her family moved to St. Laurent, Quebec in 1952 and she was confirmed in the United Church. She completed high school at Mount Royal and received a B.Sc. degree from McGill University. Nina married Rick in 1960 in a Roman Catholic ceremony. The ecumenical flavour of her spiritual journey fuels a continuing ecumenical spirit. Giving in to a long submerged "call" she studied at Queen's, was ordained by Toronto Conference in 1999 and settled to the Wyevale-Waverley Pastoral Charge where she spent six years of fulfilling ministry. A second, strong sense of call in 2005 brought her back to the Huntsville area where she served the Emsdale Pastoral Charge part-time for 14 years until she retired on June 30, 2019.

Nina has been connected to Trinity for many years and before her journey to ministry was active in a variety of capacities including the Fortnightly Club with husband, Rick. She felt organizing the Easter Sunrise Service, breakfast and preparing the mission study for the UCW were important preparation for ministry. Recently Nina served 13 months at Lake of Bays Pastoral Charge and then 13 months with the Evergreen Pastoral Charge. She is happy to be called for pulpit supply as preaching and leading worship give her joy.

Rick and Nina have two children: Lianne (Dennis) and Dean (Maria), and three grandchildren: Emma (27) (Mark), Luka (23) and Maddie (19). Rick passed away on October 6, 2019, and Dennis early in 2020. She will soon move to Ottawa (September 3) where all the family are now residing, including her new great grandson, Leo.
