Today we are continuing our message series called **The ABC'S of Faith.** So far, we have explored the meaning of **B**elief and **B**elieving and how faith is more about living in
the Way of Jesus than it is about believing a strict list of

statements or doctrines to be true. Our first week we heard how "G" for Gratitude is an act of holy defiance- refusing to allow the darkness to have the final say. Gratitude allows us to push back against the struggles in our world. Then the next Sunday we highlighted "C" for Community, Christ, and Connection. We heard that community is not something we attend but something we build. Then we delved into the letter "D" for Discipleship and how today's disciples become tomorrow's saints. Last week, our letter was "R" for Remembrance, Renewal and Resilience. Today, we are diving into the letter" F" for Forgiveness. That's a whopper for sure!

Minister's Message: "Dropping Our Stones"

A Moment of Reflection and An Invitation of Letting Go Lighting the Candle of Forgiveness

As this candle burns remember God's mercy is wider than our mistakes, deeper than our pain and stronger than any resentment we may carry. Breathe in God's love and breathe out the burdens you have been carrying.

Prayer of Forgiveness

All: God of grace, we lay our hurts in your hands. We release what no longer serves us, we surrender what we cannot change and we trust that you are still at work. Heal what is broken, mend what is torn in our lives and fill our hearts with peace. Jesus teaches us to drop the stones, remove the logs and extend mercy both to others and to ourselves. Let your grace wash over us, softening our hearts, healing our wounds and freeing us to live in a renewed lightness and wholeness. Amen.
