New Testament Reading: John 15: 12-17

(God's love is stronger than hate and God's peace is deeper than fear.)

One: Hear what the Spirit is saying to our hearts.

All: **Amen.**

One: Today we are continuing our message series called **The ABC'S of Faith.**

So far, we have explored the meaning of belief and believing and how faith is more about living in the Way of Jesus than it is about believing a strict list of statements or doctrines to be true.

Our first week we heard how G for Gratitude is an act of holy defiance, refusing to allow the darkness to have the final say. Gratitude allows us to push back against the struggles in our world. Then the next Sunday we highlighted C for Community, Christ, and Connection. We heard that community is not something we attend but something we build. Last week we delved into the letter D

for Discipleship and how today's disciples become tomorrow's saints.

Today, our letter is *"R" for Remembrance on this Remembrance Day Sunday.*

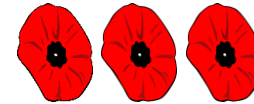

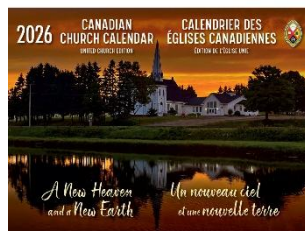
