Advent Candle Lighting Liturgy

One: This is our third Sunday in our season of Advent. Today, we light the third candle of Advent, the candle of joy. Joy often feels elusive in our world, yet Scripture tells us to expect joy even in the most unlikely places.

All: We come looking for the joy that only God can give.

One: Isaiah promises that the desert will bloom and rejoice. Jesus reminds us that God is already at work, opening eyes, healing wounds, lifting up the weary.

All: Joy can surprise us. Joy can find us. Joy can grow even in the dry places of our lives.

Our Light Bearers light our third candle - the Candle of Joy!

One: As this candle shines, may its light remind us to look for joy, not only where we expect it, but where God plants it. We see glimmers of joy in birthday candles and homemade cards, in the laughter of children and the delight of grandparents, in meals around the table and in the singing of Christmas songs.

All: Come, joy of the world. Make your home among us. Amen.

Opening Prayer

Yet your promise is that joy can bloom even there. Open our eyes to the quiet joys around us and when joy feels far away, remind us that you are ever near. We pray in the name of the One who brings joy to all people. Amen.
