The Lighting of our Advent Candles

One: Today, we are nearing the end our Advent journey. It’s Christmas Sunday. We come to the same story year after year to encounter it anew because we have changed since last Christmas. Jesus, who has the heart of God, is about to be born again. Today we will light our fourth candle, the candle of love. Love is the wick given by God to burn in our hearts.

All: We light this candle as a sign of God’s love revealed in Jesus, Emmanuel, God with us.

Feeling a pull toward something deeper?

Wondering if there’s more to life than the hurry, noise, and pressure of our everyday world? You’re not alone. Many people, especially young adults, are looking not just to *know* about the Divine, but to *experience* it. This January, Trinity United Church is offering a chance to do just that. Spiritual Director and long-time meditation guide **Alexander Jones** will lead a five-week introduction to **Christian Meditation** — a simple, grounding practice that helps us reconnect with God, nurture inner stillness, and awaken the “Divine Spark” within.
